Conservation, Revitalisation and Seismic Retrofitting of Victoria Public Hall in Dn. No. 58, Zone - V, under Singara Chennai 2.0

Victoria Public Hall, or the Town Hall, is a historical landmark building in Chennai, named after Victoria, Empress of India. One of the finest examples of British Architecture in Chennai and was built to commemorate the golden jubilee of Queen Victoria. Victoria Public Hall designed by Robert Chisholm and built by Namberumal Chetty, in the year 1888 the building is an excellent example of Indo-Saracenic architecture. The two storied building measures 48 Meters in length and 24 Meters in width and the height of the main roof is about 19 Meters high; and the total height of the tower is 34 Meters.

The scope of work includes,

- Structural repairs of the entire building
- Seismic retrofitting
- Entire roof restoration
- Exterior and Interior restoration including wooden flooring and stairs
- Up-gradation of the existing building services
- Architectural and Façade lighting
- Landscaping works

The ground floor of the building will be used as museum and allied administrative offices. The first floor of the building will be primarily used as a cultural venue with VIP and executive spaces.

The contract period is of 24 months. The contract for execution of work has been awarded to M/s. Savani Heritage Conservation Pvt. Ltd. Once the restoration is completed, the building will regain its original glory and it will be an iconic structure in Tamil Nadu.
